  Reggie was there, steadfast. It was under his watch, through his perseverance and
  collaborative spirit, that we finally saw the construction of our own ASTOA petrol
  depot finalized. This wasn't just concrete and pumps; it was security, efficiency, and a
  legacy for our members' futures a testament to Reggie's commitment to our
  association's growth and stability.

We honour him by **continuing his work**: maintaining and building upon the petrol depot he helped create, using the website he launched to strengthen our voice, and redoubling our efforts in the **community outreach programmes he held so dear**.

Reggie's physical presence is gone, but his spirit, his achievements, and the warmth of his memory remain etched in our hearts and in the foundations of ASTOA. Let his life inspire us to be better, to serve harder, and to build bridges, not walls.

Let us stand together, united in grief, and committed to honouring our brother, Reggie Baloyi, by ensuring that the association he loved so much continues to thrive and reflect his generous spirit.
